Matthew K. Emkey is a native of Wyomissing, PA, where he studied organ with Glenn Miller, Mark Laubach and Dr. Christine Clewell. He attended Wake Forest University in Winston-Salem, NC, where he received the four-year Presidential Scholarship for Distinguished Achievement as a student of Composer-in-Residence, Dr. Dan Locklair.

He served the Diocese of Palm Beach as the Director of Music Ministries & Organist at the Cathedral of St. Ignatius Loyola, Music Director & Organist at St. Vincent Ferrer Parish, and as a board member of the Diocesan Liturgical Commission, overseeing music programs for over 250,000 Catholics throughout the 52 parishes of the Diocese of Palm Beach, FL. He is the former Dean of the Palm Beach AGO Chapter and current Sub-Dean of the Portland AGO chapter.

Matt currently serves the Parish of the Holy Eucharist, the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Williston-Immanuel United Church as Director of Music & Organist, and works in administration full-time at the law firm Lambert Coffin in downtown Portland.

The Wicks Organ

The Wicks pipe organ at First Church in Marlborough was installed in 1993 and includes two manuals and full AGO pedals. The instrument consists of 20 ranks including 32 foot stops, trumpet and several mixtures. New chimes were installed in 2019.
